Yes, she's like a baby sister to me. We were at Paris Fashion Week together. She bought her son, too. after the shows, all watched movies and ate French fries!


What shows did you attend in Paris?

Yes! I think it's cathartic writing about things that happen in your life. It helps deal with the pain.


Are you still friends with your ex-fiancé?
